AWARD SUMMARY

The aim of this course is to provide participants with the skills, knowledge and experience to competently assess surf life saving awards and nationally recognised qualifications.

PRE-REQUISITES

Candidates must meet ALL of the following conditions:

- be at least 18 years of age on the date of final assessment
- hold the SLSA award that they wish to assess, but do not have to be proficient in that award unless proficiency is stipulated in the syllabus document for that particular award.

Candidates who believe they already possess some or all of the skills and knowledge of this award, or who have received one or more of the related units of competency, may wish to apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) or Credit Transfer. - Must be currently endorsed as per state requirements
- Must hold the units of competency aligned to this award (above)

ASSESSMENT

Assessment is through demonstration, presentation and application of all elements of competency in the workplace. Participants will be required to complete activities that may include role-plays, oral and written questioning, practical demonstrations and performing scenarios.

PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

There is no proficiency check for these units. However, the Assessor must remain current in the competency they are assessing AND current in training and assessment.
